About Our Event Programme Cover

This year Run Garioch held its first ever contest to design the front cover of the Event Programme, in partnership with Dandara and Run4it.

We received more than 60 entries from schools all over Aberdeenshire, including Strathburn School, Udny Green School, Rayne North School, Westhill Primary, Kemnay Primary and Banff Academy.

His design, of a very determined avocado, earned him £75 worth of vouchers from Run Garioch's retail partner, Run4it, funded by Dandara and Run4it.

Explaining the inspiration behind his design, Tomas told RGHQ that he started with the colour green, and then "something just clicked".

He told us, "I knew the colour green was important to Run Garioch, and I wanted to draw something green that was running. I thought if I just did a runner, a lot of other people would be doing that too. I wanted to make it better, so I did some research and came up with the avocado."

He then added, with a laugh, "With my mum being a dietitian and my dad being a PE teacher, it was always destined to be a fruit."

While he doesn't consider himself an artist, Tomas was very keen to give credit to his teacher, Miss McFarlane, Head of the Design and Technology Faculty at Banff Academy. She encouraged Tomas' whole class to take part in the competition, to great success: Tomas' classmate Emma Duncan (14) also made our shortlist.

Reflecting on the competition, one of the judges, Head of Sales at Dandara Aberdeen Claire Bathgate, said, "There were so many good entries it was hard to draw up a shortlist, but Tomas' design really stood out. Everyone who saw it loved it because it was a bit different and showed he was thinking out of the box.


"It perfectly encapsulates the important role exercise and healthy eating play in ensuring our good mental health and wellbeing, especially after the last two years of the pandemic."

CAT 1: GIRLS (Age 4,5,6)

Please go to your signposted warm-up area next to the running track between 12:45pm & 12:55pm, to be ready for the start at 1:00pm.

CAT 1: BOYS (Age 4.5,6)

Please go to your signposted warm-up area next to the running track between 12.55pm & 1:05pm, to be ready for the start at 1:10pm.

CAT 2: GIRLS (Age 7.8.9)

Please go to your signposted warm-up area next to the running track between 1:05pm & 1:15pm, to be ready for the start at 1:20pm.

CAT 2: BOYS (Age 7.8.9)

Please go to your signposted warm-up area next to the running track between 1:15pm & 1:25pm, to be ready for the start at 1:30pm.

CAT 3: GIRLS (Age 10,11,12)

Please go to your signposted warm-up area next to the running track between 1:30pm & 1:40pm, to be ready for the start at 1.45pm.

CAT 3: BOYS (Age 10,11,12)

Please go to your signposted warm-up area next to the running track between 1:45pm & 1:55pm, to be ready for the start at 2:00pm.

All races will start and finish on the running track in the playing fields behind the Garioch Sports Centre, under the gantry. The running track itself is located to the east of the enclosed astroturf football pitches, between the astroturf and Strathburn School.

Runners should make their way to the waiting area next to the running track at the times indicated for their categories. There will be event marshals and signage in the area to direct you. Please also feel free to ask the marshals or the volunteers at Junior Run HQ for assistance or information at any time.

Parents/guardians are NOT permitted within the waiting area, but there will be a designated area for spectators next to the start/finish line. There will also be good views of the last section of the CAT2 and CAT3 courses from Strathburn Park.

From the waiting area, each category of runners will be taken for a warm-up, and then to the start line, by members of the Junior Run Team. Please note that the boys and girls of each age category will again be running separately this year.


When the runners have finished their races, they will be directed to the finish zone, where they will await collection.



Run Garioch Goes Greener...

Everyone at Run Garioch and the Garioch Sports Centre is aware of the impact running events like ours can have on the environment – and every year we look at ways to reduce that impact.

The GSC itself is a 'Climate Challenge Fund' site, and presented at COP26 in Glasgow, showcasing its community facility NET ZERO aspirations.

We're very pleased to say that for RG2022, we have removed plastic bottles entirely from our four in-course water stations.

Water will be brought to runners in the Dandara 10K and GSC Half Marathon in large containers and dispensed into easy-to-recycle paper cups – to be disposed of in the clearly marked areas provided.

Runners will also be able to fill their own water bottles or hydration packs at each of the four water stations.

All cups from the water stations will be collected and taken away by the GSC's recycling partners, One Stop Waste, to be converted into pulp for use in new paper and card products.

As the GSC itself is a 'Not For Landfill Site', all rubbish and food waste generated in the Event Village and across the event as a whole will also be recycled by One Stop Waste.

Water at the finish will also be provided in the same easy-to-recycle paper cups, and there will also be 'Hydration Stations' at the Start/Finish area for runners to fill their own bottles both before and after the race.

Over at the CP&Co. Junior Run, the plastic water bottles available at the finish have been replaced by more easily recycled small cartons of juice.

All told, these changes will remove thousands of plastic bottles from Run Garioch.

As for the rest of the event, we have continued to work with local employers and Aberdeenshire Council to gain access to their car parks to enable car sharing, as well as continue to encourage runners to walk to and from the GSC where possible.

By choosing environmentally friendly event t-shirts and making them optional this year, we have both reduced costs for runners and cut down on potential waste.

Our medals and t-shirts have been shipped by sea, not air, to reduce their carbon footprint, and our trophies have been made from wood by a local supplier.

Our Event Programme will continue to be produced online only to reduce printing and paper waste. Our signage is always updated and reused wherever possible and we will continue to support local suppliers, charities and businesses in our Event Village and VIP Hospitality areas.

GETTING TO RUN GARIOCH

If you're driving to Run Garioch from the north of Inverurie, we would encourage you enter the town via the old A96 (Crawford Road). If you're driving from the south, please enter via the A96 at Port Elphinstone (BP station roundabout). Burghmuir Drive will be closed all day from the Morrisons roundabout to the Brankie Road junction. Burghmuir Circle will only be open for local access and VIP parking (and both only via the Strathburn Hotel junction). The Aberdeenshire Council car park at Gordon House on Blackhall Road is free for runners to use and there are also other public car parks in town, also free on a Sunday. Parking for our disabled athletes and spectators is available at the Strathburn Hotel. More detailed information about car parks, road closures and the suggested driving routes to Inverurie is available on the website.

RACE NUMBERS & TIMING CHIPS

Your electronic timing chip is incorporated into your race number. Please follow the instructions included in the Event Programme following the Essential Race Day Information pages.







RACE T-SHIRT COLLECTION

Shirts will be available for collection from the GSC before, during and after the event. Collection days/times will be posted on our social media accounts closer to race day. Please bring ID/a copy of your order.

INFORMATION/LOST PROPERTY/ENQUIRIES

Race HQ will be located in the Leisuremobile in the Event Village.

BAG DROP & CHANGING AREAS

Our changing areas and bag drop will be located in the Event Village. Volunteers from Clan will be operating the bag drop but donations will be split equally among each of our partner charities. Please use the personalised bag tag included in your race pack.

TOILETS

Toilets will be located in the lower car park as well as in the Garioch Sports Centre.

FIRST AID

Qualified first aid professionals will be based at the GSC as well as at the finish line and various points around the race routes.

EVENT VILLAGE & CATERING

Our popular Event Village will be returning for 2022, with food and fun for the whole family. The award-winning Davidsons Butchers will again be sparking up our race-day BBQ, joined for the first time by The Key Aberdeen and their healthy meals and treats. A wide range of Inverurie based clubs and community groups will also be on hand to promote their sports and raise funds. To keep the kids busy, we'll have lots of activities for them to try, in exchange for a donation to our charities.

WATER & HYDRATION STATIONS

As part of our commitment to the environment, Run Garioch has removed all single use plastics from the three water stations on the GSC Half Marathon, the one water station on the Dandara 10K and the finish lines of the main races and the CP&Co. Junior Run. Water will be supplied in recyclable paper cups on the race routes and there will also be water for those who wish to fill their own bottles/hydration packs. There will also be several hydration stations at the start/finish area for runners to fill their own bottles before and after the event.










MyLaps BibTag Instructions
